**REGIONAL DISTRICT OF OKANAGAN-SIMILKAMEEN
BYLAW NO. 1125, 1990**

A Bylaw to convert a fire protection service specified area to a local service.

WHEREAS under Section 767(4) of the Municipal Act, a regional district exercising a power to provide a service other than a general service, shall adopt a bylaw respecting that service which:

- (a) meets the requirements of Section 794 for an establishing bylaw; and
- (b) is adopted in accordance with the requirements of Section 802 as if it were a bylaw amending an establishing bylaw;

AND WHEREAS the Regional Board of the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen established by Bylaw No. 123, cited as “Specified Area D2, E2, and F2 Fire Protection Bylaw No. 123, 1971”, as amended by Bylaw Nos. 133, 418, 819, and 978, a portion of Electoral Areas D, E, and F;

AND WHEREAS the Regional Board of the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen wishes to convert the aforesaid fire protection service specified area to a local service;

AND WHEREAS under Section 788(1)(g) a regional district board may specify other classes of circumstances under which assistance will be given under the authority of fire protection service in addition to fire protection and suppression;

NOW THEREFORE the Regional Board of the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen, in open meeting assembled, ENACTS as follows:

1. The fire protection service provided within the specified area created under Bylaw No. 123, cited as “Specified Area D2, E2, and F2 Fire Protection Bylaw No. 123, 1971” as amended by Bylaw Nos. 133, 418, 819, and 978, is hereby established as a local service for the portion of Electoral Areas D and F shown outlined on the plan attached, as Schedule ‘A’ to this bylaw, and known as Electoral Areas D and F Fire Protection Local Service Area.
2. In addition to fire prevention and suppression services, assistance may be provided where harm to persons or property may result under the following classes of circumstances:
 - (a) first response to medical emergencies
 - (b) rescue operations
 - (c) mutual aid to other fire services
 - (d) response to hazardous material incidents
 - (e) public service.

3. The annual operating cost shall be apportioned amongst the participating electoral service areas on a basis of converted land and improvement assessment values:
4. **LIMIT**¹
 The maximum amount that may be requisitioned under Section 804(1)(a) of the Municipal Act for Electoral Areas 'D' and 'F' Fire Protection Local Service shall not exceed the rate of \$1.26 per \$1,000.00 of the net taxable value of land and improvements.
5. The annual operating costs shall be recovered by requisition of monies to be collected by a property value tax on land and improvements.
6. This bylaw may be cited as the "Provision of Fire Protection and Fire Regulation Enforcement within Service Areas within Electoral Areas D and F, Local Service Establishment Bylaw No. 1125, 1990".

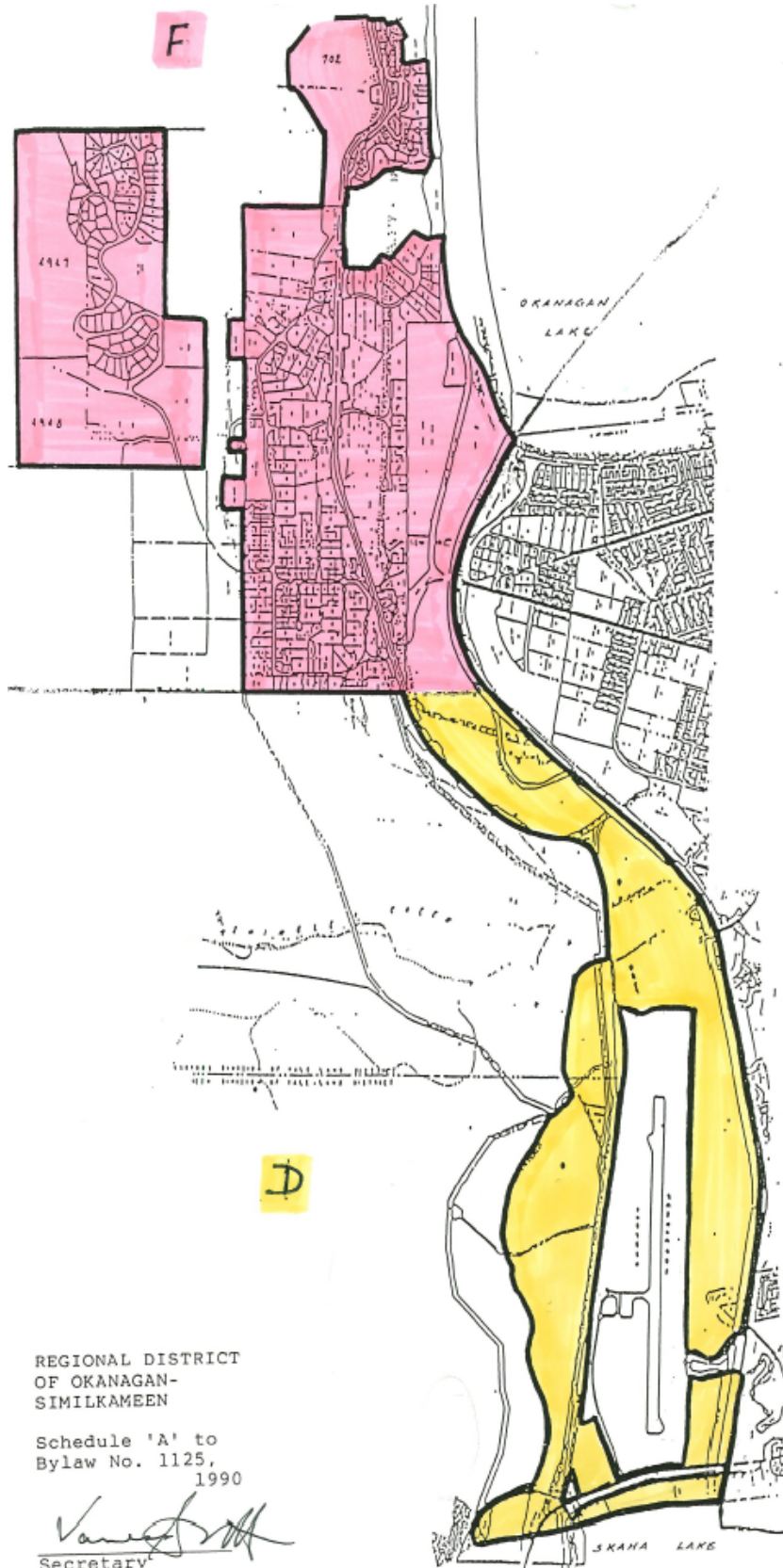
