To allow for an addition to an existing garage. The addition proposed has an 8' garage below and a 8' storage over above. This puts it above the max height of accessory buildings on RS2 zoning.

- 3. Subject to neighbourhood approval the height zoning regulation may prove to be un-necessary as the existing house is taller than the proposed garage and only slightly adjacent to it.
