D. Subdivision Servicing Bylaw Review – Campground Regulation Bylaw

MOVED and SECONDED

THAT the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen Campground Regulations Bylaw No. 2779, 2018, be kept at status quo.-**DEFEATED**

THAT the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen Campground Regulations Bylaw No. 2779, 2018, be repealed in conjunction with the introduction of a new Subdivision and Development Servicing Bylaw; and

THAT the Electoral Area zoning bylaws be amended to require:

1. a campground use be connected to a community water system and community sewer system;
2. a second access from a public highway, separated by at least 50.0 metres from the first access be provided to each campground use containing greater than fifty (50) camping spaces.-**CARRIED**

E. Subdivision Servicing Bylaw Review – Manufactured Home Park Regulation Bylaw

MOVED and SECONDED

THAT Bylaw No. 2597, 2012, the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen Manufactured Home Park Regulations, be repealed in conjunction with the introduction of a new Subdivision Servicing Bylaw; and

THAT the land use bylaws be amended to require:

1. a manufactured home park development be connected to a community water system and community sewer system;
2. a second access from a public highway, separated by at least 60.0 meters from the first access be provided to each manufactured home park use containing greater than fifty (50) homes;
3. internal access “roadway” requirements, such as minimum widths (including paved width), cul-de-sac turning radius, grade and length.-**CARRIED**
